At the request of Council member Miller, City Attorney Moore provided second reading of Ordinance 2024-5 Confirming the Sale and Awarding a Non-Exclusive Franchise to Kentucky Utilities Corporation for a Term of Ten (10) Years for Electric Franchise for the Placement of Facilities for the Transmission, Distribution, and Sale of Electrical Energy Along and Under Public Right-of-Way Within the City of Versailles, Kentucky, in Return for Payment to the City of Versailles of the Sum of Three Percent (3%) of Franchisee's Gross Receipts per Year from the Franchisee's Sale of Electricity to Electric-Consuming Entities Inside the City of Versailles's Corporate Limits and Reserving the Right to Increase Said Franchise Fee to Up to Five Percent (5%) of Franchisee's Gross Receipts per Year from the Franchisee's Sale of Electricity to Electric-Consuming Entities Inside the City of Versailles's Corporate Limits, as follows:

FIVE PERCENT (5%) OF FRANCHISEE'S GROSS RECEIPTS PER YEAR FROM THE FRANCHISEE'S SALE OF ELECTRICITY TO ELECTRIC-CONSUMING ENTITIES INSIDE THE CITY OF VERSAILLES'S CORPORATE LIMITS

WHEREAS, Ordinance No. 2024-01, adopted by the Versailles City Council, on February 6, 2024, provided for the creation and sale of a non-exclusive franchise, for a term of ten (10) years, to acquire, lay, maintain, operate, enter upon, construct, install, use and repair, in the public Right-Of-Way of the City a system or works for the generation, transmission and distribution of electrical energy from points either within or without the corporate limits of this City, to this City and the inhabitants thereof, and from and through this City to persons, corporations and municipalities beyond the limits thereof, and for the sale of same for light, heat, power and other purposes; and

WHEREAS, said ordinance also established a sealed bid process which includes advertising the invitation for bids, and awarding the franchise to the successful bidder(s); and

WHEREAS, after publication of said advertisement on February 15, 2024, the City received a bid from Kentucky Utilities Corporation.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF VERSAILLES, KENTUCKY, AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. That an electric franchise created by Ordinance No. 2024-01 be, and it hereby is, awarded to Kentucky Utilities Corporation, for the cost of advertising and sale of an electric franchise, plus three percent (3%) of its annual gross revenues, which shall be payable to the City of Versailles, Kentucky, on a quarterly basis.

Section 2. That the City of Versailles, Kentucky, pursuant Ordinance No. 2024-01 shall have the right to increase said franchise fee described above to up to five (5) percent of gross receipts per year from Kentucky Utilities Corporation's sale of electricity to electric-consuming entities inside the City of Versailles's corporate limits on or after the later of ninety (90) days after the date of the written notice or the effective date of the franchise fee specified in the City of Versailles's notice.

Section 3. All prior ordinances, municipal orders, or policies or parts thereof in conflict herewith, are to the extent of such conflict, hereby repealed.

Section 4. That the mayor of the City of Versailles is hereby authorized to sign the Franchise Agreement which to memorializes the sale by the City Versailles to Kentucky Utilities of said franchise subject to the terms and conditions reflected in Ordinance No. 2024-01 and this Ordinance.

Section 5. That the statements set forth in the Preamble to this Ordinance are hereby incorporated in this Ordinance by reference, the same as if set forth at length herein.

Section 6. That if any section, sentence, clause or phrase of this Ordinance is held to be unconstitutional or otherwise invalid, such infirmity shall not affect the validity of the remainder of the Ordinance.

Section 7. That this Ordinance shall be effective on the date of its passage.

MOTION BY DAKE, SECONDED BY JONES TO APPROVE AND ADOPT RESOLUTION 2024-4 A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY OF VERSAILLES, KENTUCKY AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR TO MAKE APPLICATION FOR AND, UPON APPROVAL, TO ENTER INTO AN AGREEMENT WITH THE KENTUCKY OFFICE OF HOMELAND SECURITY (KOHS), TO EXECUTE ANY DOCUMENTS WHICH ARE DEEMED NECESSARY BY KOHS TO FACILITATE AND ADMINISTER THE PROJECT AND TO ACT AS THE AUTHORIZED CORRESPONDENT FOR THIS PROJECT. THIS RESOLUTION ALSO ESTABLISHES PROCUREMENT POLICY FOR ANY KOHS APPROVED PROJECT FOR THE FY2024 APPLICATION CYCLE.

Chief Rankin presented the bids received for the Versailles Fire Station Design-Build Renovation and Addition. He praised the renovation committee, which included Assistant Chief Brown, Captain Ritchey, Captain Burkhardt, Firefighter Pearson, and Firefighter Bunker. He noted that the bid specifications included the base bid and six possible alternates. Chief Rankin is recommending the alternates 3, 4, 5, and 6. He stated that the bids on alternates 1 and 2 were so varied, that they are not going to complete those at this time. He recommended the low bid as presented by Mefford Contracting for the total amount of \$1,397,270 for the base bid and alternates 3, 4, 5, and 6. The bids were received as follows:

Mayor Traugott discussed the light project that is currently out for quotes. He stated that interested businesses have indicated that it will be extremely expensive to do solar/photocell lights and that electric lighting would be a more cost effective option.

He presented owner initiated change orders relating to electrical items for the Downtown Revitalization Project totaling \$24,347.80.
