MAYOR LAURA DAKE PRESIDED OVER THE MEETING. ALSO PRESENT WERE COUNCIL MEMBERS MARY BRADLEY, LISA JOHNSON, GARY JONES AND ANN MLLER. CITY ATTORNEY BILL MOORE WAS ALSO PRESENT. COUNCIL MEMBERS CHANTEL

BINGHAM AND FRED SIEGELMAN WERE ABSENT.

MOTION BY JOHNSON, SECONDED BY BRADLEY TO APPROVE AND ADOPT THE MINUTES OF THE NOVEMBER 18, 2025 REGULAR COUNCIL MEETING.

The vote was as follows: Bradley, Johnson, and Jones voting aye. Council member Miller abstained.

Public Comment

No public comment was received.

Police Chief Rob Young publicly recognized Versailles resident Stefano Slone for his recent lifesaving actions on Tyrone Bridge in Woodford County. Chief Young stated that on November 26, 2025, Mr. Slone, an employee of Carey's Towing, was towing a vehicle from an earlier accident in Versailles when he approached traffic backed up on Tyrone Bridge. A gentleman that was in a mental health crisis was on the bridge and an unidentified bystander was trying to stop the gentleman from committing suicide. Mr. Slone saw an opportunity to pull the man to safety and hold him down until first responders arrived. Chief Young presented Mr. Slone with a Certificate of Chief's Commendation for his actions on November 26, 2025. The Mayor and Council applauded Mr. Slone and praised his selfless act.

Mayor Dake read Resolution 2025-12 Honoring Judge Tony Wilhoit's 90th Birthday on November 5, 2025. The Resolution referenced Judge Wilhoit's extensive legal education and experience, awards and accolades, and his love for his family including eight children, twenty-seven grandchildren, and twenty-six great-grandchildren with three more on the way.

MOTION BY JOHNSON, SECONDED BY MILLER TO APPROVE AND ADOPT RESOLUTION 2025-12 HONORING JUDGE TONY WILHOIT'S 90TH BIRTHDAY.

Cathy Weil, Chair of the Code Enforcement Board, presented the proposed 2026 Abandoned and Blighted Properties as follows:

Public Works Director Bart Miller stated that the City had advertised for RFQs to procure professional engineering services to a new connector road that will extend Paddock Drive. He noted that it was part of the City's agreement when they sold a portion of the Edgewood acreage that the City would put in 360 feet of the connector road up to the developers frontage and two turn lanes by December 31, 2026. Mr. Miller stated that the RFQ process received five submissions which he, along with Mayor Dake and City Engineer Mary Beth Robson, reviewed and they are recommending that the City proceed with negotiations with QK4, Inc.

MOTION BY JONES, SECONDED BY BRADLEY TO APPROVE MAYOR DAKE TO NEGOTIATE A PRICE PROPOSAL WITH QK4, INC. FOR ENGINEERING SERVICES FOR THE PADDOCK DRIVE EXTENSION PROJECT.

CITY OF VERSAILLES ORDINANCE NO. 2025-20

TITLE: AN ORDINANCE CLOSING THE PUBLIC PASSWAY LOCATED BETWEEN 270 HIGH STREET AND 274 HIGH STREET.

WHEREAS, a public passway sixteen feet in width is presently located between 270 High Street and 274 High Street in the City of Versailles; and

WHEREAS, this public passway has not been utilized by the public for a number of years; and

WHEREAS, KRS 82.405 permits the City to close a public passway if the adjoining property owners agree to the closing; and

WHEREAS, the adjoining property owners of the passway at issue are the City of Versailles and K & J Frye Properties; LLC; and

WHEREAS, the City of Versailles and K & J Frye Properties, LLC have been provided written notice of the proposed closing of the public passway at issue; and

WHEREAS, both the City of Versailles and K & J Frye Properties, LLC have given their written notarized consent to the passway being closing; and

WHEREAS, the City Council has determined that it is appropriate for the City to close such passway.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF VERSAILLES, KENTUCKY as follows:

Section 1. The sixteen foot wide public passway located between 270 High Street and 274 High Street in the City of Versailles is hereby closed for its entire length.

Section 2. The Mayor is authorized to execute and deliver deeds from the City to the adjoining property owners conveying the City's interest in the passway, with each property owner receiving to the midpoint of the passway.

Section 3. This Ordinance shall become effective after the date of its passage and publication as required by law.

Introduced and given first reading at a meeting of the City Council of the City of Versailles, Kentucky, held on the 2nd day of December, 2025, and fully adopted after the second reading at a meeting of said Council held on the 16th day of December, 2025.
